Brodhead Independent

Transcriber's Note: I am sticking this in here, one issue of the Brodhead Independent from **January 15, 1864**, which contained the following marriages and deaths:

Married, on Jan. 4, by J. J. Cooks, Esq., at his residence, **John Ward** and **Juliette Purdy**, both of Spring Valley.

Married, at the same time and place as above, **Mortimer Nelson** and **Mary J. Fitch** (*or Pitch*), both of Avon.

Married, on Monday evening of the 12th, at the residence of **Myron Halsted**, Esq., by Rev. J. W. Strong, **M. Cale**(?) and **Miss E. J. Walker**, both of Brodhead.

Died, at her residence in Spring Grove, on the 1st Jan., **Mrs. Delia**(?) **Marsh**, wife of **E. (or B. or H.) Marsh**, Esq., late of Brodhead, aged 53(?) 63(?) years, seven months. Mrs. Marsh was a native of Vermont and removed to Illinois in (year is illegible, might be 1844) where she resided until a few years past, when the family removed to Spring Grove, thence to Brodhead, returning to their farm about a year since, where she died.

Below are all from the Monroe Sentinel

January 5, 1859

Died, in Sylvester on the 28th December, **Edmund Wheeler**, 59 years, 7 months and 15 days. The deceased was a native of Vermont from which place he removed in 1831(?) to this state and has been a resident ever since. He has been a professing Christian for many years and united with the Baptist Church of this place about a year ago and labored in the vineyard of the Lord the remainder of his days. During the sickness (which lasted about two weeks) he was patient and resigned and when the hour of departure came with the name of Jesus on his lips, he passed from the shores of time.

January 12, 1859 (*paper extremely faded*)

Married, in Washington on Jan. 1 at the residence of the bride's father, by Rev. R. N. Davis, (*groom's name illegible*) to **Miss Anna Rutis**(?), both of Washington.

Married, on the 22nd inst., by Rev. Patten, **John Bell**(?) of Sylvester to **Nancy** (*last name illegible*) of Jefferson.

January 19, 1859

Married, by Rev. G. R. Patton, Jan. 8, **David Taylor** to **Malinda Holt**(?), both of Juda.

Married, on the 13th inst., by T. H. Eaton, Esq., **John A. Wartenbeck** to **Amelia**(?) **E. Hind**, both of Monroe.

Feb. 2, 1859

Died, on the 31st ult., **Julia M., daughter of Pliny and Charity Murry**, aged 2 years, 5 months and 15 days.

Died, in this village on the 24th Jan., **Elijah G. Strong**, formerly of Montpelier, Vermont, in his 36th (?) 56th (?) year. His quiet yet useful life during a residence of nearly eight years in this city won for him the esteem of all and as a token of respect the places of business were closed during the hours of the funeral service.

Married, at the Monroe House, on the 3rd Feb., by L. Rote, Esq., **William Dennis** to **Meribay(?) Wickersham**, both of Monroe.

Feb. 16, 1859

Married, at Clarno, on the 10th inst., by H. S. Barber, Esq., **Mobert Trick, Jr.**, to **Lydia Swearingen**, both of Clarno.

Feb. 23, 1859

Married, on the 12th inst., by Elder F. B. Rolph, at his residence in the township of Jefferson, **Henry F. Dewiler** to **Mary Ann Helyer**, both of Sterling, Whiteside Co., IL.

Married, in the town of York, on the 20th (?) Feb., by J. F. Wolcott(?), Esq., **Jacob Gafrelt** and **Maria Ames(?)** of the town of York.

Died, in this village on the evening of the 17th inst., **Malinda A., wife of Thomas L. Lindsey**, aged 46. The deceased leaves behind a husband and ten children. Her last sickness was protracted through six long weeks of excruciating suffering which was born with singular patience. She was not terrified by death and died in hope. The funeral on Friday was attended by a large concourse of friends and neighbors.

March 2, 1859

Died, of croup, at Monroe, on Saturday, the 19th Feb., **George L.**, only son of **James C. and Nancy Nobles**, 15 years, 9 months and 24 days.

Married, at Jefferson by Elder P. H. Green, March 6, **Jacob M. Davis** and **Amelia H. Coe**, both of Monroe.

Married, at Monroe on the 8th inst., by T. H. Eaton, Esq., **Daniel Moore** to **Ann Augusta Winslow**, both of Monroe.

Died, on the 5th March at the residence of her father in Exeter, **Mrs. Abical Churchill, wife of Edward Churchill**, aged 18 years, 3(?) (8?) months and 10 days, **daughter of Stephen and Armida(?) Estee**.

March 23, 1859

Married, on Thursday, 17th March at the residence of the bride's father, by Rev. J. T. Westover of Monroe, **A. A. Kindrick**, Esq., of St. Louis to **Mrs. Mary A. Little** of Delavan.

Died, on the 16th March at Monroe, **Charlie**, only **son of J. & S. Lockwood**, aged one year, nine months and sixteen days.

April 6, 1859

Married, on the 18th ult., at Janesville at the residence of Rev. W. Scoffield, **John A. Chambers** of Jefferson to **Mary A. Glover** of Rock Grove.

Married, at Monroe on the 30th ult., by T. H. Eaton, Esq., **William Schwerin** to **Mina Hackt**, both of Monroe.

Married, on the 30th ult., by Elder F. B. Rolph at his residence in the township of Jefferson, **Henry Henderson** to **Lydia Humphrey**, both of Rock Run, Stephenson Co., IL.

Married, on the 31st ult., by the same, **Andrew J. Scheidegger** of Clarno to **Anna Ruf** of Monroe.

Also on, on the same day by the same, **Christian Winger** to **Mrs. Catharine Truxil**, both of Monroe.

Married, on the 3rd April, by Rev. Nathaniel Wheeler in the township of Sylvester, **J. M. Dodge** to **Florence A. Royce**.

April 20, 1859

Died, on the town of Adams, on April 1, **Jane Kelly(?)**, in the 18th year of her age.

May 11, 1859

Married, on the 8th (?) 9th (?) inst., at the house of **Riley Carey** in the town of Clarno, by R. H. Millman, **Anthony Hill** to **Sarah Jane Carter**, both of Clarno.

On Tuesday morning, our young friend **C. C. Clawson** called to pay a good bye as he was going to start out for "the Peak". He has promised to write us and I told him his letters will be read with interest by a large number of his friends.

The Albany Times of the 4th says that on the Sunday previous the **son of Mr. Porter** of Johnstown was instantly killed by the accidental discharge of a gun.

May 18, 1859

Married, on Thursday, 12th inst., by Rev. G. R. Patton, **John Hull** of Exeter to **Ann Janet Covell** of Sylvester.

May 25, 1859

On Wednesday of last week, **Delross Hurlbut** and **Louis Knudson** returned to Monroe having made nearly half the trip across the Plains. They said they became satisfied there was not gold in paying quantities in any of the mines and they therefore returned. Young **T. J. Hurlbut** who went with the party is at St. Joseph, Missouri and will return soon with the others.

June 8, 1859

Married, on the 22nd inst., by Elder E. P. Green, at his residence, **Pleasant Smith** to **Emeline Cornelia Henry**, both of Green County.

June 29, 1859

Married, at Logansport, Ind., on Tuesday, 10th inst., by Elder J. W. T. MacMullen, **Jeremiah Bridge** of Green Co., to **Mrs. Sarah Matthews** of Logansport.

July 16, 1859

Married, at the residence of the bride's father on Wednesday, 29th ult., by Rev. M. Bennett, **E. E. Bryant**, Esq., to **Lou S. Boynton**, both of this place.

Probate: **Nathaniel Preston**, application for an extension of settling his affairs.

Probate: **Patrick Silver**, deceased, **Ann Silver** applying to be administrator of estate.

July 20, 1859

On Monday of last week, a little girl, ten years of age, **Ann Haulerein**, was accidentally drowned near the mill of **Isaac Williams** in the town of Cadiz, while bathing in the company of two other little girls. She was not recovered until she had been in the water half an hour.

Died, in this village on Monday, July 11, **Mrs. Perlina Shaughnessy**, daughter of **Mr. Sutherlin**, 19 years, 8 months and 14 days.

Died, at Smith's Ferry, Sutter Co., California, on April 28, **E. H., wife of T.N. Machin**, 24 years, 3 months, formerly of this place.

Died, at Monroe on the 24th inst., **Henry, son of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Beers**, aged 20.

August 24, 1859

Married, at Monroe on the 18th inst., by B. F. Hancock, Esq., **Eleazer Canfield** to **Drucilla F. Lee**, both of Harlin, Stephenson Co., IL.

Married, on the 21st inst., by the same, at his residence, **Simon Brown** to **Minerva Bennett**, both of Jefferson.

August 31, 1859

Married, at Monroe, on the 23rd inst., by T. H. Eaton, Esq., at the Monroe House, **Ira Winslow** of Monroe to **Emily Beedy** of Cadiz.

Died, on the 24th inst., **Elizabeth**, youngest **child of Everhard and Rebecca Walter**, 8 months, 11 days, of infirmity of the brain.

September 7, 1859

Married at Monroe by T. H. Eaton, Esq., (*date illegible*), **John G. Schaffer** to **Barbary (not Barbara) Heldt**, both of Monroe.

Died, in Painesville at the residence of his son-in-law **George W. King**, on the 25th (?), **Captain Benjamin Adams**, aged 76 years, 3 months, born in Gorham, Maine. He approached the age of manhood with an active and vigorous mind, which qualified him for every situation to which he was called to act. He held many responsible offices of which he discharged with fidelity. He served as an officer in the War of 1812 in the regular army. Politically, he was a Democrat, casting his vote in 1804 for Thomas Jefferson, voting for every Democrat president from Jefferson to James Buchanan. He has left a family of children and grandchildren to honor his good name and imitate his virtues.

of those popular conductors that have given such a popularity to the M. & M.R.R. and during his brief stay in Monroe won many friends.

Died, at Monroe on the 19th inst., **John Washington, son of John J. and Anna Desire Snider**, aged 2 years, one month and 3 days.

Died, at Clarno, on Wednesday morning, 14th inst., **Martha Jane, daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth Campbell**, in the 8th year of her age.

Died, on the 20th inst., of disease of the lungs, **William Bullock**, (*aged illegible, maybe 86, maybe 36???*). The deceased was one of the first settlers of Monroe and leaves a wife and three children.

Died, on the 21st inst., **Ave Marin**, only **daughter of William and Elizabeth Porter**, aged one year, eleven months.

October 5, 1859

Married, on the 2nd Oct., in the M. E. Church in this village, on Sabbath evening, by Rev. Mr. Boardman, **George W. Sanborn** to **Miss E. E. Richards**, both of this village.

Married, in Beloit on Sabbath evening, 2nd Oct., in the 1st Congregational Church, by Rev. H. N. Brinsmade, **W. H. Strong** of Janesville to **Abby J. Moore** of Beloit.

October 12, 1859

Married, at Wyota on the 27th Sept., by Rev. D. H. Palmer, **Henry Pinkham** to **Miranda A. Ovlatt**, both of Argyle.

Married, on the 25th Sept., by Rev. G. R. Patton, **Bowen R. Clawson** to **Matilda R. South**, both of Jefferson.

Married, on the 9th Oct., by the same, **Franklin R. Rhoderick** to **Ellen Wheeler**, both of Juda.

Married, by the same, on the same day, **John Hurlbut** to **Lorinda D. Smiley**, both of Albany.

The happy bridegroom has been a resident of our town but a short time yet has already won the esteem of a large circle of friends.

Married, in Monroe on the 5th inst., by T. H. Eaton, Esq., **Jackson Earlywine** to **Mary J.** *(last name partially illegible, - - both)*, of Clarno.

In the last Brodhead Reporter, we find the following spunky correspondence:

Whereas, my wife **Sarah Vanderbilt**, has left my bed and board without just provocation, therefore, all persons are forbidden to labor her or trust her on my account as I will pay no debts of her contracting after this date. **D. Vanderbilt**

Reply:

In reply to the above, I would say that so far as my leaving is concerned, it is strictly true; but when he states that I did so without any just provocation, he states what not only he and I but all our neighbors and this community generally

know to be a bare faced falsehood. **Mr. Vanderbilt** has been unremitting in his efforts since our marriage to swindle me out of my own property which I held in my own right when I married him and he has succeeded to quite an extent. In regards to the board, he knows as well as many others that my money has bought what we have lived upon for the past two years. I, therefore, forbid any one harboring him or trusting him on my account after this date and I further forbid any one purchasing more of my property from him as I will hold them strictly accountable for the same.

The Albany Times of the 2nd inst., stated that the stable and granary of **Edward Gillies** of Mt. Pleasant burned to the ground Wednesday while he was in Albany. All his hay, grain, etc., was destroyed and two valuable horses were only saved by the heroic efforts of **Mrs. Gillies** who rushed into the burning stable and got them out. The fire is supposed to have been set by an Irish woman named **Brown** who has been since arrested.
